## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT REQUIRING THE DIRECTOR OF CIVIL SERVICE TO HOLD A COMPETITIVE PROMOTIONAL EXAMINATION PRIOR TO HIS CALLING FOR ANY EXAMINATION FOR SAID TITLE OR GRADE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph B of section 15 of chapter 31 of the General Laws,  
2 as amended by section 2 of chapter 317 of the acts of 1952, is  
3 hereby further amended by striking out the second sentence and  
4 inserting in place thereof the following sentence:— In case an  
5 eligible list of at least two available persons is not established  
6 from such promotional examination, then a competitive pro-  
7 motional examination shall be held open to any class within the  
8 service of the same or any other department, or division of a de-  
9 partment, as the director may determine.

The Constitution of the Government

Article I. The Legislative Power

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or add to the Rules and Regulations of the foregoing Provisions.

Section 5. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall begin at Noon on the first Monday in December; but they may by Law alter the Day of the Commencement of such regular Sessions, and may extend the same from Year to Year.

Section 6. The Congress shall hold its regular Sessions at the City of Washington, but may at any time by Law change the same.
