SENATE No. 1109

By Mr. Locke, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1109) of David H. Locke and Robert C. Buell for legislation to deprive a convicted state, county, municipal or other employee from receiving any retirement benefits upon conviction of a crime related to his employment. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety.

AN ACT DEPRIVING A CONVICTED STATE, COUNTY, MUNICIPAL OR OTHER EMPLOYEE FROM RECEIVING ANY RETIREMENT BENEFITS UPON CONVICTION OF A CRIME RELATED TO HIS EMPLOYMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law
2 to the contrary, any present or former officer or employee of the
3 commonwealth, or of any department, board, commission,
4 agency, or political subdivision thereof, or of any authority
5 created by the general court, or any other employee as defined
6 in section 1 of chapter 268 A of the General Laws, who is convicted
7 of misconduct in such office or employment, shall not be entitled
8 to receive, or continue to receive, a pension or retirement
9 allowance under chapter 32 or under any other public employee
10 retirement system of which he is a member.
