AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF BERNARDSTON TO
BORROW MONEY FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of constructing and
2 originally equipping and furnishing a consolidated
3 school building, the town of Bernardston may borrow,
4 from time to time, within a period of five years from
5 the passage of this act, such sums as may be necessary,
6 not exceeding in the aggregate three hundred thousand
7 dollars, and may issue bonds or notes of the town
8 therefor, which shall bear on their face the words,
9 "Bernardston School Loan, Act of 1949." Each
10 authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan, and
11 such loans shall be paid in not more than twenty years
12 from their dates. Indebtedness incurred under this
13 act shall be in excess of the statutory limit, and shall,
14 except as herein provided, be subject to chapter forty-
15 four of the General Laws exclusive of the limitation
16 contained in the first paragraph of section seven
17 thereof.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW IN RELATION TO
SCHOOL HOUSES AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. For the purpose of constructing and
- 2 acquiring equipment and furnishing a consolidated
- 3 school building, the town of Hamden may borrow
- 4 four years to run, within a period of five years from
- 5 the passage of this act, such sums as may be necessary,
- 6 not exceeding in the aggregate three hundred thousand
- 7 dollars, and may issue bonds or notes of the town
- 8 therefor, which shall bear on their face the words
- 9 "Hamden School Loan, Act of 1878," both
- 10 authorized loans shall constitute a separate fund, and
- 11 such loans shall be paid in not more than twenty years
- 12 from their date. Indebtedness incurred under this
- 13 act shall be in excess of the statutory limit, and shall
- 14 except as herein provided, be subject to chapter forty-
- 15 four of the General Laws, and the provisions of the section
- 16 contained in the last paragraph of section seven
- 17 thereof.
