AN ACT

To Incorporate the Gerrish Market.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows :*

1 SECT. 1. George W. Gerrish, Charles L. Hancock,
2 George Meacham, Robert Farley, their associates and
3 successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name
4 of the Gerrish Market, for the purpose of owning
5 and managing a market for the sale and storage of
6 country produce, and other merchandize, now located
7 in Sudbury Street, between Portland and Friend Streets,
8 in the northerly section of the city of Boston, with
9 all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the
10 duties, liabilities and restrictions, set forth in the forty-
11 fourth chapter of the Revised Statutes: *provided*, that
12 nothing contained in this act shall be construed to
13 authorize said corporation to engage in buying or
14 selling produce or merchandize of any description.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and per-
2 sonal estate for the purpose aforesaid, not exceeding
3 in amount three hundred thousand dollars: *provided*,
4 that no shares in the capital stock of said corporation,
5 shall be issued for a less sum or amount, to be actually
6 paid in on each, than the par value of the shares
7 which shall be first issued.

1 SECT. 3. The city of Boston may, by its city coun-
2 cil, or by any person or body to whom said council
3 shall delegate its power, make and enforce suitable
4 and proper police regulations, in and around said
5 market and its appurtenances.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
