In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two.

AN ACT

To regulate Marking of Actions for Trial in the
County of Suffolk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. On and after the first day of Octo-
2 ber in the year nineteen hundred and two all ac-
3 tions at law in the superior court in Suffolk county
4 may be advanced upon the lists for trial in the
5 same manner and on the same notice to parties or
6 attorneys in and by which proceedings in equity
7 are marked for hearing, and actions so advanced
8 shall be placed in order upon the short list at the
9 end of the list as left over from the court day
10 preceding the day to which said actions are ad-
11 vanced.

1 SECTION 2. Section one of this act shall be
2 construed as superseding and abolishing the pro-
3 visions of section twenty-five of chapter one hun-
4 dred and fifty-seven of the Revised Laws.
