AN ACT RAISING THE MINIMUM AGE OF LICENSED MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATORS TO SIXTEEN YEARS AND SIX MONTHS OF AGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 8 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by inserting after the word "years" in the first sentence of said
3 section the words: — and six months, — so that the last clause
4 of said sentence shall read as follows:— and no such license
5 shall be issued to any person under sixteen years and six months
6 of age.

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT PASSED IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND FORTY-NINE, RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in and for the said Commonwealth, at the City of Boston, this 15th day of February, A. D. 1866.

SECTION 1. In the first section of the several laws heretofore enacted, relating to the registration of voters, the word "person" in the first section, shall be construed to mean a male person of the age of twenty-one years, and the word "person" in the second section, shall be construed to mean a male person of the age of twenty-one years, and the word "person" in the third section, shall be construed to mean a male person of the age of twenty-one years.
