AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MAINTENANCE OF CERTAIN RECORDS AT THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 2 of Chapter 127 of the General Laws as appearing in
- 2 the 1990 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the
- 3 following paragraph: —
- 4 The superintendents shall keep a written report of the number
- 5 of assaults on employees committed by inmates, the nature of
- 6 injury sustained, the length of absence from work due to such
- 7 injuries, and the outcome of criminal charges as a result of the
- 8 assault, if any. The latter information shall be compiled and
- 9 submitted by the commissioner of corrections on a monthly basis
- 10 to the crime reporting unit of the criminal history systems board.
