### AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE PRACTICE OF OPTOMETRY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter one hundred and twelve of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section  
3 sixty-six, as inserted by chapter seven hundred of  
4 the acts of nineteen hundred and twelve, the following  
5 new section:—

6 *Section 66A.* No optometrist shall engage directly  
7 or indirectly in the sale of spectacles, eye glasses,  
8 frames or lenses to any person whose vision he has  
9 examined and prescribed for, nor shall said optome-  
10 trist profit, directly or indirectly, from the sale of  
11 spectacles, eye glasses, frames or lenses to any person  
12 whose vision he has examined and prescribed for.  
13 Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be  
14 punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars,  
15 nor more than five hundred dollars, or by imprison-  
16 ment for not more than six months, or both.
