AN ACT RELATIVE TO RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE RATE SETTING COMMISSION FOR PRIVATE EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS UNDER SPECIAL NEED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first sentence of the sixth paragraph of section 32 of chapter
2 6A of the General Laws, as appearing in section 2 of chapter 1229
3 of the acts of 1973, is hereby amended by adding the following
4 words: — ; provided, however, that such rate adjustments shall not
5 apply to private educational institutions which provide services to
6 cities and towns under special needs educational programs gov-
7 erned by chapter seventy-one B, the rates for which shall be estab-
8 lished annually on or before the second Tuesday of December.

The following amendments were proposed to the bill as reported, and were adopted by the committee on the following vote: Yea, 10; Nays, 0.

SECTION 1

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
