The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty.

An Act to authorize the City of Cambridge to appropriate Money for Athletic Clothing for the Equipment of Athletic Organizations composed of School Pupils.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city of Cambridge may appropri-
2 ate a sum not to exceed three thousand dollars in any
3 one year for athletic clothing for the equipment of
4 athletic organizations composed of school pupils.
5 The amount so appropriated shall be deemed a part
6 of the amount that may be raised for school purposes
7 under chapter one hundred and eighty-four of the
8 acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-six and amend-
9 ments thereof and additions thereto.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for ac-
2 ceptance to the registered voters of the city of Cam-
3 bridge at the biennial state election in the current
4 year in the form of the following question, which shall
5 be placed upon the official ballot to be used in said
6 city at said election: — “Shall an act passed by the
7 General Court in the current year, entitled, ‘An Act
8 to Authorize the City of Cambridge to appropriate
9 Money for Athletic Clothing for the Equipment of

10 Athletic Organizations Composed of School Pupils',
11 be accepted? ". If a majority of the voters voting
12 thereon vote in the affirmative in answer to said
13 question, this act shall thereupon take effect, but not
14 otherwise.
