RESOLVE on the Petition of Eleazer Homer.

*Resolved*, for reasons set forth in the said petition, that there be allowed and paid, out of the treasury of this Commonwealth, to Eleazer Homer, the sum of five hundred dollars, in full for services in arranging and indexing revolutionary documents, and that a warrant be drawn accordingly. [*Approved by the Governor, March 3, 1842.*]

RESOLVES upon the Petition of Daniel Hammond.

*Resolved*, That upon Daniel Hammond conveying to the Commonwealth, by proper deed or instrument, to be approved by the attorney general, one undivided half part of township No. 3, in the fourth range north of the Bingham Kennebec Purchase, so called, in the state of Maine, the treasurer and receiver general of the Commonwealth be authorized and directed to repay to him, by the surrender of notes now held against him, a sum equal to one half of the original price agreed to be paid by said Hammond for the township aforesaid, with simple interest thereon from the time said purchase-money was paid, or came upon interest by the terms of the contract of purchase and sale of said township: *provided*, said Daniel Hammond shall, at the time of executing such deed or instrument, enter into and make to the Commonwealth suitable bond or bonds, to be approved by the attorney general, conditioned to have partition made of said township by three commissioners mutually agreed upon, or, in case of disagreement, by a disinterested commissioner selected by each party, and an umpire selected by the two so appointed, upon the request or demand of the land agent of the Commonwealth, and to execute all deeds or instruments necessary and proper to carry such partition into effect.

*Resolved*, That the land agent of the Commonwealth be, and he is hereby authorized to cause such commissioner or commissioners to be selected, and to execute, in behalf of the Commonwealth, all such deeds or instruments as may be necessary or proper to carry such partition into effect.

And *resolved, further*, That said land agent be, and he is hereby authorized to accept a delivery of any deed or deeds which the said Hammond shall execute in accordance with the foregoing resolve, in behalf of the Commonwealth. [*Approved by the Governor, March 3, 1842.*]

RESOLVES concerning Normal Schools and School District Libraries.

1. *Resolved*, That the sum of six thousand dollars, annually, for three years, be and the same is hereby appropriated to the support of normal schools, under the direction of the board of education. And his excellency the governor is
