

HOUSE No. 1256.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred.

AN ACT

To authorize the Milford, Attleborough and Woonsocket Street Railway Company to increase its Capital Stock, to issue Bonds and to extend its Railway.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Milford, Attleborough and
2 Woonsocket Street Railway Company is hereby
3 authorized to increase its capital stock to an
4 amount which together with the amount hereto-
5 fore authorized shall not exceed three hundred
6 thousand dollars, and to issue bonds to an amount
7 not exceeding the capital stock issued, for the
8 purpose of extending its tracks upon such loca-
9 tions as may be granted to it under the provisions
10 of law, and for purchasing equipment, for con-

11 structing power stations, and for acquiring real
12 estate and other property to be used in con-
13 nection with the construction and operation of its
14 railway.

1 SECTION 2. The said company may extend,
2 maintain and operate its tracks in any street or
3 place the use of which is granted to said com-
4 pany under its act of incorporation, or by the
5 selectmen of the towns of Mendon and Hopdale
6 in the county of Worcester. And said railway
7 company may, to avoid curves or grades, build,
8 maintain and operate its railway on land outside
9 the highway, with the approval of the board of
10 railroad commissioners, and provided that it is
11 authorized so to do by the selectmen of towns,
12 or by the boards of aldermen of cities wherein it
13 is now authorized to construct its road, and may
14 acquire land, by purchase or lease, for this pur-
15 pose.

1 SECTION 3. No stock or bonds shall be issued
2 under this act until such issue has been approved
3 by the board of railroad commissioners; and a
4 certificate setting forth such approval shall be
5 executed by the board and filed in the office of
6 the secretary of the commonwealth.
