The Dominions of Saskatchewan

in the Year 1898

The Dominion of Saskatchewan was created by the Dominion of Saskatchewan Act, 1898, which was passed by the British Parliament on the 12th day of August 1898. The Act provided for the creation of the Dominion of Saskatchewan, which was to be bounded on the north by the 54th parallel of latitude, on the south by the 49th parallel of latitude, on the east by the 100th meridian of longitude, and on the west by the Rocky Mountains. The Dominion of Saskatchewan was to be a separate Dominion, and was to be governed by a Lieutenant-Governor appointed by the British Government.
