AN ACT MAKING ALL MANNER OF MOTOR VEHICLE HOMICIDE A FELONY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 90, section 24G(b) is hereby amended by striking out
2 “shall be punished by imprisonment in a jail or house of correc-
3 tion for not less than thirty days nor more than two and one-half
4 years, or by a fine of not less than three hundred nor more than
5 three thousand dollars, or both,” and inserting in place thereof the
6 following: — “shall be punished by imprisonment in the state
7 prison for not more than five years, or by imprisonment in a jail or
8 house of correction for not more than two and one-half years or by
9 a fine of not more than three thousand dollars, or by both such
10 fine and imprisonment.”
