## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT ELIMINATING AND/OR SHARING ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION WITH THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of Massachusetts General  
2 Laws, Chapter 74, Section 8 et seq, or any general or special law to  
3 the contrary, that the Commonwealth of Massachusetts eliminate  
4 and/or assume and pay fifty percent (50%) of the costs associated  
5 with and/or arising out of the enrollment of a town resident in an  
6 accredited agricultural educational program.

of the 14th day of July 1878, and the same shall be in force from and after the date of the passage of this act.

**The Constitution of the State**

SECTION 1. The Constitution of the State shall be the supreme law of the State, and any law inconsistent therewith shall be void.

SECTION 2. The Legislature shall have the power to alter, amend or repeal any law passed by it.

SECTION 3. The Governor shall have the power to pardon and commute the punishment of any offender against the State, except in cases of impeachment.
