AN ACT EXTENDING COVERAGE UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY
ACT TO ALL PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter nine hundred and forty of the acts of nineteen hun-
2 dred and seventy is further amended to cover in the applicable
3 sections all public employees but excluding all elected officials
4 and temporary appointees by the executive and legislative
5 branches of government.
