AN ACT

To incorporate the Springfield Home for Friendless Women and Children.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. Rachel C. Merriam, Charlotte Barnes,
2 Caroline L. Rice, Martha L. Hixon and Sarah D.
3 Walker, of Springfield, their associates and suc-
4 cessors, are hereby made a corporation by the name
5 of the "Springfield Home for Friendless Women and
6 Children," for the purpose of providing a temporary
7 home for destitute and friendless women and children,
8 with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all
9 the duties, liabilities and restrictions set forth in the
10 sixty-eighth chapter of the General Statutes.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold, for the pur-
2 pose aforesaid, real and personal estate to the amount
3 of twenty thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from its
2 passage.
