AN ACT

Relating to the Duties of Judges of Probate and
Insolvency.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. When a judge of probate and insol-
2 vency is unable to perform his duties, or if there is
3 a vacancy in the office in any county, the duties of
4 such office shall be performed in the same county,
5 by the judge of probate and insolvency of any
6 other county designated by the register of pro-
7 bate and insolvency from time to time as necessity
8 or convenience may require.

1 SECT. 2. Such register shall certify on his
2 records, and also to the treasurer of the Common-
3 wealth, the number of days and the dates of the
4 same in which said duties are performed by the

5 judge of another county under the provisions of
6 the preceding section.

1 SECT. 3. The judge performing the duties
2 aforesaid shall be entitled to receive from the
3 treasury of the Commonwealth, in addition to the
4 amount now allowed to him by him by law, the
5 sum of fifteen dollars a day for each day that he
6 performs such duties.

1 SECT. 4. The register of probate and insol-
2 vency for the county of Suffolk shall, upon the
3 passage of this act, certify to the treasurer of the
4 Commonwealth the number of days and dates of
5 the same, since the thirty-first day of December,
6 in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one,
7 which the judge of another county has performed
8 the duties of the judge of probate and insolvency
9 for the county of Suffolk; and the judges who
10 have from time to time, since said thirty-first day
11 of December, performed such duties, shall be
12 entitled to receive for such service the sum of
13 fifteen dollars a day, to be paid from the treasury
14 of the Commonwealth.

1 SECT. 5. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
