AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any assistant attorney general in office on the
2 effective date of this act who has had not less than
3 twenty years of service on that date, may, on or
4 before December thirty first, nineteen hundred and
5 forty-eight, become a member of the state retirement
6 system by depositing in the annuity savings fund of
7 said system the sum of one thousand dollars. There-
8 after, upon reaching the maximum age for his group,
9 or if he has attained such maximum age, then within
10 two years from the operative date of this act, he shall
11 receive from the commonwealth a retirement allow-
12 ance or pension of twenty-four hundred dollars per
13 annum.
