

SENATE No. 106

To accompany the petition of John H. Mack that the 19th day of April be excluded from the list of legal holidays; and to provide that May 30th be known as Patriots' Memorial Day. Legal Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen.

AN ACT

To exclude the Nineteenth Day of April from the List of Legal Holidays and to provide that the Thirtieth Day of May shall be known as Patriots' Memorial Day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The ninth clause of section five of chapter eight
2 of the Revised Laws, as amended by chapter one
3 hundred and thirty-six of the acts of the year nine-
4 teen hundred and eleven, is hereby further amended
5 by striking out the words " the nineteenth day of
6 April ", in the second and third lines, by inserting
7 after the word " May ", in the third line, the words:
8 — to be known as Patriots' Memorial Day, — and
9 by striking out the word " four ", in the sixth line,

10 and inserting in place thereof the word:— three,—
11 so as to read as follows:— *Ninth*. The words
12 “ legal holiday ” shall include the twenty-second
13 day of February, the thirtieth day of May, to be
14 known as Patriots' Memorial Day, the fourth day of
15 July, the first Monday of September, the twelfth
16 day of October, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas
17 Day, or the day following when any of the three
18 days first mentioned, the twelfth day of October or
19 Christmas Day occurs on Sunday; and the public
20 offices shall be closed on all of said days.
