AN ACT ESTABLISHING A CENTRAL MASSACHUSETTS SOLDIERS HOME.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 There is hereby established at the Clock Tower complex on the
- 2 grounds of the State Hospital at Worcester a Central Massachu-
- 3 setts Soldiers Home. The home shall provide short and long term
- 4 domiciliary care for male and female veterans who though ambula-
- 5 tory and self-sufficient, are in need of care, due to age, homeless-
- 6 ness, sub-standard housing accommodations, unemployment, or
- 7 psychological problems. The governor shall appoint a comman-
- 8 dant and supporting staff for the daily operation of the home.
