AN ACT PROVIDING FOR INCENTIVES IN SUBDIVISIONS AND ZONING FOR ALTERNATIVE ENERGY SOURCES — SOLAR AND OTHER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 81Q of chapter 41 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding the following after the sentence: —
3 “The rules and regulations may, however, provide that not more
4 than one building designed or available for use for dwelling pur-
5 poses shall be erected or placed or converted to use as such on any
6 lot in a subdivision, or elsewhere in the city or town, without the
7 consent may be conditional upon the providing of adequate ways
8 furnishing access to each site for such building, in the same manner
9 as otherwise required for lots within a subdivision.” —

10 The rules and regulations shall require that all applicants submit
11 subdivision plans which provide for solar siting of all structures
12 and accessory structures to be constructed therein.

1 SECTION 2. Section 9 of chapter 40A is hereby amended in
2 the second paragraph by inserting after the words “traffic or
3 pedestrian improvements” the words: — “installation of alterna-
4 tive energy sources”.
