The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING MEDICAL SCHOOLS IN MASSACHUSETTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any tax-exempt medical school, dental school, or
2 pharmaceutical college, or any school offering graduate
3 work leading to a doctor's degree in physiology,
4 pathology, nutrition, or allied sciences, in the study
5 of which live animals are used for research, experi-
6 ments, observation or instructions, shall be subject
7 to the following regulations:—

8 (a) Students shall not be admitted or denied ad-
9 mittance in accordance with any "Quota System"
10 based on race, creed, color, national or regional origin
11 except as specified below.

12 (b) Places in each entering class shall be open to
13 the most qualified students chosen in order of their
14 rank by process of open examination.

15 (c) Examination questions and grades shall be on
16 file and checked by the state commissioner of educa-
17 tion, who shall have access to permanent files of all
18 examination papers and shall make the decisions in
19 case of dispute.
