AN ACT

To amend the Charter of the City of Cambridge
Concerning the Election of Aldermen.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The board of aldermen of the city
2 of Cambridge shall consist of two citizens of each
3 ward, elected at large by the qualified voters of
4 the city voting in their respective precincts, and
5 the two candidates from each ward who have the
6 highest number of votes shall be declared elected.

1 SECT. 2. All parts of the charter of the city
2 of Cambridge, or amendments thereto, incon-
3 sistent herewith are hereby repealed.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance by a majority of the qualified voters
3 of the city of Cambridge present and voting
4 in their respective precincts at the next state
5 election following the passage of this act.
