AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE STATE POLICE ASSOCIATION OF MASSACHUSETTS
AND INTEREST ARBITRATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 28K of chapter 32 of the General Laws as amended by
2 St. 1991, c. 499, sec. 16, is hereby amended by inserting at the
3 end thereof the following: —

4 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, an employee of
5 the commonwealth or its political subdivisions who is a full-time
6 representative of an employee organization, which has included in
7 its membership employees of the commonwealth or its political
8 subdivisions may, while on leave of absence for the purpose of
9 acting as a full-time representative of said employee organization,
10 be entitled to payment of salary for the period of assignment as a
11 full-time representative of such employee organization, if the col-
12 lective bargaining agreement entered into between the common-
13 wealth or its political subdivisions and the employee organization
14 provides for such payment. For the purpose of this paragraph,
15 political subdivision shall not include city or town.”
