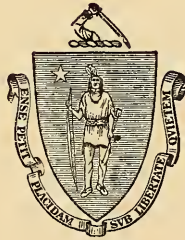

BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF NURSES,
STATE HOUSE, BOSTON, Dec. 31, 1913.

To His Excellency EUGENE N. FOSS.

SIR: — In compliance with section 9 of chapter 449 of the Acts of 1910, the Board of Registration of Nurses respectfully submits its annual report for the year ending Dec. 31, 1913.

The number of nurses applying for registration this year is 426; number registered is 358; rejected, 56; and 12 are on the list for examination at such time as they may elect.

The number of nurses registered since the organization of the Board in October, 1910, is 5,863. Of this number, 5,208 were registered under the provisions of section 5 of the registration act, which provided for the registration during a limited period of two classes of nurses without requiring any examination test whatever as to their fitness to care for the sick. One class included applicants who had "had such experience in a hospital or training school as in the opinion of the board would justify registration." This classification is regarded as a most unfortunate feature of the law, unjust both to the trained nurse and to the public. A knowledge of nursing acquired solely by an experience of five years in intermittent caring for the sick cannot be regarded as an equivalent of three, or even of two, years of constant preparation in a hospital training school.

Of the number 5,208, registered as provided in section 5, without an examination, 588 belong to the five-year class. Registration under section 5 ceased in April, 1911. Since that time 652 applicants have been registered, and 100 have been rejected.

The law requires the Board to hold three examinations in each year, one in January, one in April and one in October. The examinations consist of both written and practical exer-

cises. The subjects discussed are general nursing, ethics, dietetics and infant feeding, obstetrics, anatomy and physiology and home sanitation.

Nurses desiring to take an examination must file their applications not later than *five days* before the examination date. Application blanks are mailed to nurses on request.

Nurses who have secured registration through examination in another State, and who have located in this State to engage in professional nursing, can apply for registration under section 6, which provides that the Board "shall have power to register, . . . without examination, any person who has been registered as a professional nurse in another State." The Board, however, strongly recommends such persons to apply for registration under the provisions of section 3, which requires an examination. A registration secured in this manner receives the highest commendation.

Due consideration for the protection of society against incompetent service in the sick room has induced most of the States to enact laws relative to the registration of nurses, the fundamental idea being supposedly that the public has a right to know from some authoritative source that persons holding themselves out as competent to care for the sick have qualified themselves for such service by a reasonable amount of training-school instruction and hospital service. But the Massachusetts law disregards this fundamental principle, and as its chief aim provides an easy method for an indiscriminate registration of nurses, the capable and incapable, the really competent nurse who has graduated from a three-year course in a general hospital and the partially trained nurse holding a certificate of graduation from a two-year course in some small private hospital or sanatorium.

The Board is of the opinion that graduates only of creditable training schools should be eligible to take the State examinations, and that the Board should have authority to inspect the numerous training schools in the Commonwealth to determine their standing.

The Board therefore recommends that section 3 of chapter 449 of the Acts of 1910 be amended by striking out all of the words in the said section, as printed in the Acts and Resolves of

the year 1910, as far as the word "An", in the twelfth line, and inserting in place thereof the following: —

Applicants for registration under this section who shall furnish the board with satisfactory proof that they are twenty-one years of age or over, of good moral character, and that they have received certificates of graduation from a training school for nurses considered efficient by the board, shall, upon the payment of a fee of five dollars, be examined, and if found qualified, shall be registered and authorized to use the title Registered Nurse, and shall receive a certificate thereof from the board signed by its chairman and secretary.

The board shall have authority under this section to investigate at any time the several training schools for nurses in this commonwealth, for the purpose of determining their efficiency as shown by their general equipment, by the character, the methods, and the extent of instruction given therein. The expense, as approved by the chairman and secretary of the board, of such investigations, shall be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth from the fund standing to the credit of the board, — so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows: —

Section 3. Applicants for registration under this section who shall furnish the board with satisfactory proof that they are twenty-one years of age or over, of good moral character, and that they have received a certificate of graduation from a training school for nurses considered efficient by the board, shall, upon the payment of a fee of five dollars, be examined, and if found qualified, shall be registered and authorized to use the title Registered Nurse, and shall receive a certificate thereof from the board signed by its chairman and secretary.

The board shall have authority under this section to investigate at any time the several training schools for nurses in this commonwealth, for the purpose of determining their efficiency as shown by their general equipment, by the character, the methods, and the extent of instruction given therein. The expense, as approved by the chairman and secretary of the board, shall be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth from the fund standing to the credit of the board. An applicant who fails to pass an examination satisfactory to the board, and is therefore refused registration, shall be entitled, within one year after such refusal, to a re-examination at a meeting of the board called for the examination of applicants, without the payment of an additional fee. The said board may, after a hearing, by vote of a majority of its members, annul the registration and cancel the certificate of any nurse; and, without a hearing, may annul the registration and cancel the certificate of a nurse who has been found guilty of a crime or misdemeanor. All fees received by the board shall once a month be paid by its secretary into the treasury of the commonwealth.

Owing to the resignation of Dr. Edwin B. Harvey, as secretary of the Board of Registration in Medicine, on April 1, he ceased at that time to be the secretary of this Board.

The Board desires to express its appreciation of the great assistance rendered by Dr. Harvey in the early days of its organization, and feels that to his counsel and interest it owes, to a great degree, whatever efficiency it may have attained, and that in his death the Board has sustained a great personal loss.

The registration act now in force is printed in the Appendix; also an alphabetical list of the names of nurses registered this year.

APPENDIX.

LAW RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF NURSES.

CHAPTER 449 OF THE ACTS OF 1910.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF NURSES.

SECTION 1. A Board of Registration of Nurses is hereby established to consist of five members. One member shall be the secretary of the board of registration in medicine, ex officio; the other four members shall, within sixty days after the passage of this act, be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the council. Three members shall be nurses holding diplomas, each from a different training school for nurses giving at least a two years' course in the theory and practice of nursing in a hospital, and they shall have had eight years' experience in nursing the sick. The fifth member shall be a physician who is superintendent of a hospital having a training school for nurses. The four appointive members shall be appointed to serve as follows: one member for one year, one for two years, one for three years and one for four years from the first day of October, nineteen hundred and ten, and until their respective successors are appointed; and thereafter the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall annually, before the first day of October, appoint one person qualified as aforesaid to hold office for four years from the first day of October next ensuing. Vacancies in said board shall be filled for the unexpired term in the manner of the original appointment. Any member of the said board may be removed, for cause, by the governor with the advice and consent of the council.

SECTION 2. The members of said board shall meet at the office of the board of registration in medicine on the second Tuesday of October, nineteen hundred and ten, and annually thereafter, and shall immediately proceed to organize by electing a chairman who shall hold office for the term of one year. The secretary of the board of registration in medicine shall be secretary of the board of registration in nursing, and shall receive as compensation therefor such sums as may be fixed by the governor and council, to be paid from fees received hereunder. The said board shall hold three regular meetings in each year; one on the second Tuesday of January, one on the second Tuesday of April, and one on the second Tuesday of October at the office of the board of registration in medicine, and it may hold additional meetings at such times and places as it may determine.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of said board, immediately upon its organization, to notify all persons engaged in the practice of nursing the sick in this commonwealth of the times, places and subjects of the examinations for registration, by publication in one or more newspapers in each county. Application for registration shall be made upon blanks to be furnished by the board, and shall be signed and sworn to by the applicants. An applicant for registration who shall furnish satisfactory proof that he or she is at least twenty-one years of age, and of good moral character shall, upon payment of a fee of five dollars, be examined by the said board, and, if found to be qualified, shall be registered, with a right to use the title Registered Nurse, and shall receive a certificate thereof from the board signed by the chairman and secretary. An applicant who fails to pass an examination satisfactory to the board, and is therefore refused registration, shall be entitled, within one year after such refusal, to a re-examination at a meeting of the board called for the examination of applicants, without the payment of an additional fee. The said board may, after a hearing, by vote of a majority of its members, annul the registration and cancel the certificate of any nurse; and, without a hearing, may annul the registration and cancel the certificate of a nurse who has been found guilty of a crime or misdemeanor. All fees received by the board shall once a month be paid by its secretary into the treasury of the commonwealth.

SECTION 4. Examinations shall be partly in writing in the English language and partly in practical work, and shall include the principles and methods of nursing. Due credit shall be given for examinations in special branches.

SECTION 5. Any resident of this commonwealth who shall make application for registration within one year after the passage of this act, and who shall prove to the satisfaction of the board, by affidavit or otherwise, that he or she was actually engaged for five years next prior to the date of application in nursing the sick in a competent manner or has had such experience in a hospital or training school as, in the opinion of the board, would justify registration, shall be registered without examination on the payment of a fee of five dollars.

SECTION 6. The board shall have power to register in like manner, without examination, any person who has been registered as a professional nurse in another state under laws which in the opinion of the board maintain a standard substantially similar to that of this act.

SECTION 7. Each member of the board, except the secretary, shall receive five dollars for every day actually spent in the performance of his or her duties: *provided, however*, that in no event shall the total sum paid to any member of said board exceed one hundred and fifty dollars in any one year, and the necessary travelling expenses actually incurred in attending the meetings of the board, not exceeding three cents a mile each way. The said compensation and travelling expenses and any in-

cidental expenses necessarily incurred by the board or any member thereof shall, if approved by the board, be paid from the treasury of the commonwealth, but only from the fees paid into the said treasury by the board.

SECTION 8. The board shall investigate all complaints of violation of the provisions of this act, and report the same to the proper prosecuting officers.

SECTION 9. The board shall keep a record of the names of all persons registered hereunder, and of all money received and disbursed by it, and a duplicate thereof shall be open to inspection in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth. Said board shall annually, on or before the first day of January, make a report to the governor of the condition of professional nursing in this commonwealth, of all its official acts during the preceding year, and of its receipts and disbursements.

SECTION 10. Whoever, not being authorized to practice as a registered nurse within this commonwealth, practices or attempts to practice as a registered nurse, or uses the abbreviation, R. N., or any other words, letters, or figures to indicate that the person using the same is such a registered nurse, shall for each offence be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars. Whoever becomes registered or attempts to become registered, or whoever practices or attempts to practice, as a registered nurse under a false or assumed name, shall for each offence be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment for three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 11. This act shall not apply to gratuitous nursing of the sick by friends or members of the family, or to the acts of any person nursing the sick for hire who does not assume to be a registered nurse.

SECTION 12. The board may make such rules and regulations with reference to procedure hereunder as it may deem expedient, provided that the same are not inconsistent with this act or with any other law of the commonwealth.

SECTION 13. For the purpose of the appointment of said board and of the registration of persons by it hereunder, this act shall take effect upon its passage, and it shall take full effect on the first day of October in the year nineteen hundred and ten. [*Approved April 27, 1910.*]
