

HOUSE No. 624

By Mr. Bruce of Everett, petition of Charles Bruce for legislation to establish a district court in the city of Everett. Judiciary (Joint).

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Two.

An Act to establish the District Court of Everett.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter two hundred
2 and eighteen of the General Laws, as most recently
3 amended by section two hundred and nine of chapter
4 three hundred and ninety-four of the acts of nine-
5 teen hundred and thirty-one, is hereby further
6 amended by striking out the paragraph contained
7 in lines one hundred and three and one hundred and
8 four and inserting in place thereof the following two
9 paragraphs:—The first district court of eastern
10 Middlesex, held at Malden; Malden, Wakefield,
11 Melrose and Medford.

12 The district court of Everett held at Everett.

1 SECTION 2. The governor shall forthwith upon
2 the taking effect of this act appoint a justice and
3 two special justices for said court.
