AN ACT

Relative to Laundries.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The boards of health of the sev-  
2 eral cities and towns shall establish such regula-  
3 tions for the conduct of the laundry business  
4 within their several jurisdictions as cleanliness,  
5 the health of the employees and patrons of laun-  
6 dries, and the public safety may, in the opinion  
7 of said boards, require.

1 SECTION 2. The laundry business shall not be  
2 carried on in any apartment used for sleeping, or  
3 in which is located any urinal, privy, or water-  
4 closet.

1 SECTION 3. Whoever violates any provision  
2 of this act, or any regulation made by a board  
3 of health hereunder, shall be punished by fine not  
4 exceeding fifty dollars, or by imprisonment not  
5 exceeding three months, or by both such fine and  
6 imprisonment. Police, district and municipal  
7 courts shall have jurisdiction of offences com-  
8 mitted under this act.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect on the  
2 first day of July in the year eighteen hundred  
3 and ninety-eight.
