AN ACT REQUIRING THAT LEGISLATORS BE NOTIFIED OF THE SALE, LEASE, OR TRANSFER OF STATE-OWNED PROPERTY WITHIN THEIR DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 7 of the General Laws, as most recently amended
2 by Chapter 579 of the Acts of 1980, is hereby further amended
3 by striking out the first sentence in section 40 I and replacing
4 it with the following: —

5 *Section 40 I.* At least 60 days prior to any purchase, rental,
6 sale, or significant change in the use of two acres or more of
7 real property by the commonwealth on behalf of state agen-
8 cies, the deputy commissioner of capital planning and opera-
9 tions shall notify, in writing, the city council in the case of
10 a city, or the board of selectmen in the case of a town, the
11 regional planning agency of the region in which the real prop-
12 erty is located, and the members of the General Court who
13 represent the city or town in which said real property is lo-
14 cated, of such action.

Article I of the Constitution of the United States
Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested
in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a
Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of
Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several
States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications
 requisite for Electors in that State.
