Abstract: This collection documents Demakis's career as a Massachusetts Representative from the 8th Suffolk District.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection documents Paul Demakis's years as a state representative in the Massachusetts General Court. Some of the major topics covered in the subject and legislative files are abortion rights (particularly buffer zones around abortion clinics), Massachusetts Turnpike air rights, and domestic partnership. The case files and neighborhood files (especially Back Bay) often concern issues relating to neighborhood life: parking, traffic, trash cleanup, relations between residents and businesses, and conflicts between residents.

In this guide to the collection, “case files” refer to both interactions with constituents who asked for help on various issues and constituent correspondence regarding legislation. They usually include a copy of Demakis’ outgoing correspondence and the incoming correspondence or phone message that triggered the action. For the majority of the case files, a brief description of the topic has been included in the folder title listing. If there is no topic noted, either the topic was difficult to discern or more than one topic is covered in the file. Case files marked “office hours” usually contain just a letter from Demakis thanking the subject for attending his neighborhood office hours. Legislative files also contain constituent correspondence.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Paul C. Demakis was born in Lynn, Massachusetts, in 1953. He received his Bachelor’s degree from Harvard College in 1975 and his law degree from Harvard Law School in 1978. Before becoming a state Representative, Demakis was a member of the Democratic Committee for Ward 5 (Boston), General Counsel for the Executive Office of Transportation and Construction from 1983 to 1984, and tax counsel for the Appellate Tax Board (1984-1986 and 1993-1994) and a member from 1986 to 1993.

Demakis represented the 8th Suffolk District as a Democrat in the Massachusetts House of Representatives from 1995 to 2004. In 2003, the boundaries of the 8th Suffolk District changed to include portions of Cambridge including the MIT area, Cambridgeport, and East Cambridge. Demakis was on the Transportation, Government Relations, Judiciary, Local Affairs, Public Service, and Housing and Urban Development Committees. His legislative priorities were abortion rights and buffer zones for abortion clinics, Massachusetts Turnpike air rights, and domestic partnership.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Arrangement

The collection remains in the order in which it was received by the State Library. The arrangement and folder labeling are somewhat inconsistent. There are several alphabetical runs of mixed legislative and subject material that overlap in time frame and alphabetical range. It is possible that these different arrangements were stored in different parts of the legislative office by different staff members. The most effective way to search for a particular topic in the collection will be to conduct a keyword search of the entire finding aid since files for one topic may reside in many different physical locations.
