AN ACT

To Enlarge the Powers of the School Committee of
the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section six of chapter two hun-
2 dred and forty-one of the acts of the year eighteen
3 hundred and seventy-five is repealed, and the fol-
4 lowing substituted therefor: —

5 “Sect. 6. The school committee shall have full
6 power and authority to order to be made on the
7 school buildings any additions, alterations and
8 repairs, for school purposes, which it deems to be
9 necessary; to provide temporary accommodations
10 for school purposes; to select, bond and purchase
11 the land required for school buildings and their
12 yards; and to fix finally and conclusively the plans
13 for school buildings to be erected; *provided*, that

14 nothing herein shall authorize said school com-
15 mittee, in behalf of the city of Boston, to expend,
16 or contract to expend, for said purposes any
17 money in excess of the amount previously appro-
18 priated therefor.”

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
