

2. Approximately one and one tenth acres along Mountain Road in an unused portion of the Erving Cemetery, as shown on said map, now owned by said town and dedicated to cemetery purposes.

3. Approximately one and two tenths acres northerly of the existing location of said Route 2 and easterly of High Street, containing a well and appurtenances thereto, as shown on said map, now owned by said town and dedicated to water supply purposes.

SECTION 3. Any land transferred to or taken by the department of public works under the provisions of this act which said department determines is not required for highway purposes may be transferred to the department of natural resources for conservation and forestry purposes.

Chap. 707. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ASSISTANT CHIEF DEPUTY SHERIFF FOR ATTENDANCE ON THE SUPERIOR COURT IN SUFFOLK COUNTY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 221 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 71A, inserted by chapter 177 of the acts of 1949, and inserting in place thereof the following section:—

Section 71A. The sheriff of Suffolk county may designate two of the court officers of the superior court to act as assistant chief deputy sheriffs for attendance on the superior court in said county. Such officers, in addition to their regular duties as court officers, shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be prescribed by the sheriff.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the city of Boston in the current year, but not otherwise.

Chap. 708. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF BRAINTREE TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE PAYMENT OF AND TO PAY MARJORIE J. HOLM AND HARRY W. HOLM FOR CERTAIN DAMAGES SUSTAINED BY THEM.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The town of Braintree is hereby authorized to appropriate money for the payment of, and after such appropriation the treasurer of said town is hereby authorized to pay Marjorie J. Holm and Harry W. Holm, both of said town, as co-payees, a sum not to exceed fifteen thousand five hundred dollars for damages sustained by them in regard to property located at 575 Washington street in said town.

Chap. 709. AN ACT TO ASCERTAIN THE WILL OF THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF PITTSFIELD RELATIVE TO AN IMMEDIATE CEASE FIRE IN INDOCHINA AND TO AN IMMEDIATE WITHDRAWAL OF ALL UNITED STATES TROOPS AND MILITARY EQUIPMENT FROM SOUTHEAST ASIA.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. In order to ascertain the will of the voters of the city of Pittsfield, there shall be placed upon the official ballot to be used at the
