AN ACT REPEALING SO MUCH OF THE HORSE AND DOG RACING ACT, SO CALLED, AS RELATES TO DOG RACING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The provisions of chapter one hundred and twenty-
2 eight A of the General Laws, inserted by section three
3 of chapter three hundred and seventy-four of the acts
4 of nineteen hundred and thirty-four, and as amended,
5 so far as they apply to the licensing of dog races on
6 which the pari-mutuel system of betting shall be
7 permitted, are hereby repealed.
