Program Description	Signature Healthcare's Emergency Department physicians provide education to community EMS, police, and fire. Dr. Muse coordinates teaching rounds with local EMS teams 15 times per year, in addition to holding conferences twice per year. These conferences include education on a variety of topics including Human Trafficking: Legal and Social Ramifications, Domestic Abuse, Adverse Childhood Events, Pediatric Trauma Care and Newborn Care in field delivery, to name a few. EMS professionals delivering patients to the Signature ER are invited to watch life-saving stenting procedures in one of two Brockton Hospital Cardiac Catheterization labs - closing the loop on what happens after they drop off a patient in cardiac arrest. The simulation lab is a cooperative venture between local EMS departments and Signature Healthcare. The mannequins provide the opportunity for medics to practice life-saving skills in real life environments. This also assures continued improvement in areas of care that may occur infrequently such as pediatric codes.

Program Description	Signature Healthcare and Dr. Dan Muse have established a very close relationship with the City of Brockton. Dr. Muse is the Medical Director for Brockton Police and Fire. He also serves as Medical Director for the Brockton Fire Department Dispatch. For the last four years, Dr. Muse has been part of Brockton Police Department's yearly mental health training. He also works closely with local police and fire on special programs in their departments and towns. A new program "Save A Life" is being launched in 2020. This program works in conjunction with local EMS to train citizens of their communities in life saving techniques of CPR, AED use, Naloxone administration and "Stop The Bleed" skills. Each year, Dr. Muse, in conjunction with local District Attorney's offices, talks to schools and local groups about substance abuse. Dr. Muse continues to teach nurses and athletic trainers how to recognize an opioid overdose and use naloxone.

This conference provided an in depth training that focused on effective communication skills and the potential risks and benefits of opioids for managing chronic pain. The training includes the assessment of opioid misuse risk and how to manage opioid therapy including opioid tapers using a patient centered approach.</p> <p>The committee has also reached out to improve access to doctors and facilities that are involved in medically assisted treatment. As an advisor to the Plymouth County Policy Outreach Committee, Dr. Muse assisted in the Narcan distribution initiative to family, friends and those suffering with Substance Abuse Disorder.</p>
