## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

AN ACT REQUIRING THE STATE LOTTERY COMMISSION TO DISCLOSE ODDS OF WINNING ON TICKETS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 24 of chapter 10 of the General Laws, as most recently  
2 amended by chapter 156 of the Acts of 1974, is hereby further  
3 amended by inserting after the second sentence the following new  
4 sentences: —

5 The commission shall have printed clearly on the face of each  
6 ticket, share, coupon or receipt a disclosure of the odds of winning  
7 by a purchaser of a particular game for which the said ticket, share  
8 or coupon is sold. The commission shall as part of any advertise-  
9 ments for the state lottery, whether in newspapers, posters, bill-  
10 boards, radio, television or any other medium, disclose the odds of  
11 winning as part of said advertisements.
