AN ACT TO FURTHER CLARIFY THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS RELATIVE TO COMPETITIVE PROMOTIONAL EXAMINATIONS TO THOSE EMPLOYEES OF THE LABOR SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 15B of chapter 31 is hereby amended by inserting,
2 after the first sentence, the following sentence: — The director
3 of civil service may consider as eligible to participate in such
4 examination any permanent employee in the official service who
5 has been employed after certification for at least one year in a
6 position the duties of which partake in part of the duties ordi-
7 narily classified in the labor service.
