AN ACT

Making Appropriations from the Income of the several
Funds therein mentioned, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—*

1 SECT. 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned, are
2 appropriated, and shall be allowed and paid out of
3 the income of the several funds mentioned herein, to
4 wit:

5 The income of the Rogers book fund shall be
6 expended in accordance with the conditions named by
7 the donor, in conformity with chapter two hundred
8 and fifteen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred
9 and fifty-seven.

10 The income of the Todd normal school fund shall
11 be paid to the treasurer of the board of education, to
12 be applied in such manner as shall be prescribed by

13 said board, in accordance with chapter thirty-six of
14 the General Statutes.

15 The income of the Indians school fund shall be
16 applied according to the provisions of chapter thirty-
17 six of the General Statutes.

1 SECT. 2. The sums mentioned in this section are
2 appropriated, and shall be allowed and paid out of
3 the Charles River and Warren Bridges fund, for the
4 year eighteen hundred and sixty-three, to wit:

5 For repairs on said bridges and buildings belonging
6 thereto, a sum not exceeding nineteen hundred
7 dollars.

8 For the compensation of the draw-tenders on said
9 bridges, in conformity with an act of the year eighteen
10 hundred and sixty-one, chapter ninety-six, a sum not
11 exceeding twenty-three hundred dollars.

12 For horse-keeping, a sum not exceeding three
13 hundred dollars.

14 For gas, oil, fluid and fuel, a sum not exceeding
15 eight hundred and fifty dollars.

16 For incidental expenses, a sum not exceeding three
17 hundred and fifty dollars.

1 SECT. 3. The sums mentioned in this section are
2 appropriated, and shall be allowed and paid out of the
3 moneys arising from the tolls collected, on the Essex
4 bridge, for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-three,
5 to wit:

6 For the salary of the agent of said bridge, the sum
7 of one hundred dollars.

8 For the compensation of the toll-gatherers and
9 draw-tenders upon said bridge, a sum not exceeding
10 six hundred dollars.

11 For the repair and maintenance of said bridge, a
12 sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

13 For gas, oil and fluid, a sum not exceeding two
14 hundred dollars.

15 For incidental expenses, a sum not exceeding twen-
16 ty-five dollars.

17 And all moneys arising from the tolls on said bridge
18 shall be paid into the state treasury.

1 SECT. 4. In all cases for which no other provision
2 is made by law, the income or any surplus thereof, of
3 all funds belonging to, or in the custody of the Com-
4 monwealth, shall be added to the principal.

1 SECT. 5. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
