**AN ACT TO ENCOURAGE THE INSTALLATION OF BURGLAR AND FIRE  
ALARMS IN OWNER-OCCUPIED DWELLINGS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 6 of Chapter 64H of the general laws, as most re-  
2 cently amended by section 22 of chapter 261 of the acts of  
3 1980, is hereby further amended by adding the following new  
4 subsection: (ii) Any burglar or fire alarm system or com-  
5 ponent which is installed in an owner occupied dwelling house  
6 of up to three residence units.
