AN ACT

In Further Addition to the Several Acts making Sundry Miscellaneous Appropriations authorized during the Present Year, and for Certain Other Expenses authorized by Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 hereby appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, unless
4 hereinafter otherwise provided, for the purposes speci-
5 fied, to wit:—

6 For expenses in connection with dredging a channel
7 in Plymouth harbor, and for dredging a basin for turn-
8 ing vessels at the inner end of the same, as authorized
9 by chapter five hundred and thirty-one of the acts of
10 the year nineteen hundred and seven, a sum not ex-
11 ceeding eleven hundred sixty-nine dollars and fifty-five
12 cents, the same to be in addition to any amount here-
13 tofore appropriated for this purpose.

14 For the protection of the public health in the valley
15 of the Neponset river, as authorized by section five of

16 chapter six hundred and fifty-five of the acts of the
17 present year, a sum not exceeding seventy-five thousand
18 dollars.

19 For the expenses of retiring and pensioning prison
20 officers and instructors, as authorized by chapter six
21 hundred and seventy-three of the acts of the present
22 year, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, the
23 same to be in addition to any amount heretofore au-
24 thorized for the same purpose.

25 To provide for the better prevention of forest fires,
26 as authorized by chapter seven hundred and twenty-two
27 of the acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding ten
28 thousand dollars, the same to be in addition to any
29 amount heretofore appropriated for the purpose.

30 For compensation of the members of the committee
31 appointed in the year nineteen hundred and ten to in-
32 vestigate the suicide of John Newman and the treat-
33 ment of the inmates at the Lyman school for boys, as
34 authorized by chapter one hundred and thirty-two of
35 the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
36 twenty-one hundred dollars, the same to be in addition
37 to any amount heretofore appropriated for legislative
38 committee expenses.

39 To provide a pension for Salem P. Haddock, as au-
40 thorized by chapter one hundred and thirty-three of the
41 resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding nine
42 hundred thirty-five dollars and seventy-five cents, to be
43 paid from the Metropolitan Parks Maintenance Fund.

44 For the widow of Henry E. Turner, the balance of
45 the salary to which he would have been entitled had
46 he continued in office to the end of the term for which
47 he was elected, the sum of twenty-seven hundred twenty-
48 eight dollars and fifty cents.

49 For the investigation by the metropolitan park com-

50 mission as to the advisability and cost of a parkway
51 connection between Winthrop parkway in the town of
52 Revere and Winthrop shore reservation in the town of
53 Winthrop, as authorized by chapter one hundred and
54 thirty-five of the resolves of the present year, a sum
55 not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars, to be paid
56 from the Metropolitan Parks Maintenance Fund.

57 For an additional water supply at the Lakeville state
58 sanatorium, as authorized by chapter one hundred and
59 thirty-six of the resolves of the present year, a sum not
60 exceeding three thousand dollars.

61 For certain improvements at the Monson state hos-
62 pital, as authorized by chapter one hundred and thirty-
63 seven of the resolves of the present year, a sum not
64 exceeding eighteen thousand dollars.

65 For certain improvements at the Westfield state sana-
66 torium, as authorized by chapter one hundred and
67 thirty-eight of the resolves of the present year, a sum
68 not exceeding thirty-eight hundred dollars.

69 To provide for certain improvements at the state
70 prison, as authorized by chapter one hundred and thirty-
71 nine of the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
72 ceeding five thousand dollars, the same to be paid from
73 the State Prison Industries Fund.

74 For certain improvements at the industrial school for
75 boys, as authorized by chapter one hundred and forty
76 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
77 thirty-four thousand four hundred and fifty dollars.

78 For the investigation by the director of the bureau
79 of statistics relative to the indebtedness of cities and
80 towns, as authorized by chapter one hundred and forty-
81 two of the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
82 ceeding five thousand dollars.

83 For the expenses of the prison commission in making

84 a report to the next general court of a plan relative to
85 prison industries, as authorized by chapter one hundred
86 and forty-three of the resolves of the present year, a
87 sum not exceeding five hundred dollars.

88 To provide for a representation of the commonwealth
89 at the American Land and Irrigation Exposition, by
90 the state board of agriculture, as authorized by chapter
91 one hundred and forty-four of the resolves of the pres-
92 ent year, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.

93 For certain improvements at Penikese hospital, as
94 authorized by chapter one hundred and forty-five of
95 the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
96 thirty-three hundred and fifty dollars.

97 For expenses of the commission to investigate the
98 engineering expenses of the commonwealth, as author-
99 ized by chapter one hundred and forty-six of the re-
100 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding one
101 thousand dollars.

102 For certain improvements at the state infirmary, as
103 authorized by chapter one hundred and forty-seven of
104 the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
105 thirty-four thousand seven hundred dollars.

106 For certain improvements at the Massachusetts hos-
107 pital school, as authorized by chapter one hundred and
108 forty-eight of the resolves of the present year, a sum not
109 exceeding twenty-six thousand dollars.

110 For certain improvements at the Worcester state
111 asylum, as authorized by chapter one hundred and forty-
112 nine of the resolves of the present year, a sum not
113 exceeding eighty-eight thousand four hundred dollars.

114 For certain improvements at the Worcester state hos-
115 pital, as authorized by chapter one hundred and fifty
116 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
117 twelve thousand one hundred dollars.

118 For the commonwealth's portion of the expense of
119 the new bridge over Weymouth back river, in the town
120 of Weymouth and the town of Hingham, as authorized
121 by chapter seven hundred and thirty-nine of the acts
122 of the present year, a sum not exceeding thirty-six thou-
123 sand dollars.

124 For the salaries of the justices of the supreme judicial
125 court, as authorized by chapter seven hundred and forty-
126 three of the acts of the present year, a sum not exceed-
127 ing fifty-one hundred dollars; and for the salaries of
128 the justices of the superior court, as authorized by the
129 last mentioned act, a sum not exceeding fourteen thou-
130 sand seven hundred dollars. These two sums to be in
131 in addition to any amounts heretofore authorized for
132 the same purposes.

133 For the salary of a watchman at the state arsenal,
134 as authorized by chapter seven hundred and forty-seven
135 of the acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding two
136 hundred and fifty dollars.

137 For preliminary plans, specifications and estimates
138 provided for by the acts relative to the construction and
139 improvement of buildings at state and other institutions,
140 a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars, the same to
141 be in addition to any amount heretofore appropriated
142 for the same purpose.

143 To provide for the improvement of a highway in
144 the counties of Berkshire and Hampshire, as authorized
145 by chapter seven hundred and eleven of the acts of the
146 present year, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars,
147 the same to be in addition to any amount heretofore
148 appropriated for the maintenance of state highways.

149 For salaries and other necessary expenses in the office
150 of the supervisor of loan agencies, as authorized by
151 chapter seven hundred and twenty-seven of the acts of

152 the present year, a sum not exceeding two thousand
153 dollars.

154 To provide for a system of sewerage at the Wrentham
155 state school, as authorized by chapter one hundred and
156 fifty-two of the resolves of the present year, a sum not
157 exceeding thirteen thousand dollars.

158 To provide for printing additional copies of the re-
159 port of the commission appointed to investigate the
160 question of the increase of criminals, mental defectives,
161 epileptics, degenerates and allied classes, as authorized
162 by chapter one hundred and fifty-three of the resolves
163 of the present year, a sum not exceeding one hundred
164 dollars, the same to be in addition to any amount here-
165 tofore appropriated for the same purpose.

166 To provide for the preparation and printing of an
167 annotated edition of the insurance laws, as authorized
168 by chapter one hundred and fifty-four of the resolves
169 of the present year, a sum not exceeding seven hundred
170 dollars.

171 For salaries and expenses of three additional in-
172 spectors to be appointed by the board of railroad com-
173 missioners, as authorized by chapter six hundred and
174 eighty-one of the acts of the present year, a sum not
175 exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars, the same to be
176 in addition to any amount heretofore appropriated
177 for the same purpose.

178 For printing the report of the board of railroad com-
179 missioners, a sum not exceeding two hundred seven
180 dollars and fifty-five cents, the same to be in addition
181 to any amount heretofore appropriated for the same pur-
182 pose.

183 For travel of the members of the house of representa-
184 tives, as authorized by chapter one hundred and fifty-
185 five of the resolves of the present year, a sum not

186 exceeding sixty-eight hundred seventy-five dollars and
187 twenty cents; for travel of the members of the senate,
188 as authorized by the same resolve, a sum not exceeding
189 eleven hundred and eight dollars, both amounts to be
190 in addition to any amounts heretofore appropriated for
191 these purposes.

192 For improvements at the Northampton state hospital,
193 as authorized by chapter one hundred and fifty-six of
194 the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
195 forty-six thousand nine hundred and twenty-five dol-
196 lars.

197 To provide for the construction of a bridge and ap-
198 proaches thereto to carry the driveway of the Quincy
199 shore reservation over the tracks of the New York, New
200 Haven and Hartford Railroad Company, as authorized
201 by chapter one hundred and fifty-seven of the resolves
202 of the present year, a sum not exceeding twenty thou-
203 sand dollars, to be paid out of the Metropolitan Parks
204 Maintenance Fund.

205 For legislative committee expenses, to provide for the
206 expenses of the special recess committee on redistricting
207 the state into congressional districts, a sum not exceed-
208 ing fifteen thousand dollars, the same to be in addition
209 to any amounts heretofore appropriated for the same
210 purpose.

211 To complete the remodeling of the buildings at the
212 leper hospital on Penikese island, as provided for by
213 chapter one hundred and thirty of the resolves of the
214 year nineteen hundred and nine, a sum not exceeding
215 five hundred seventy-three dollars and ninety-six cents.

216 To provide for certain expenses at the Westborough
217 state hospital incurred in the year nineteen hundred
218 and nine, a sum not exceeding one hundred thirty-three
219 dollars and forty-seven cents.

220 To provide for the salaries and expenses of the board

221 to be appointed to supervise the payments to employees
222 for personal injuries received in the course of their em-
223 ployment, as authorized by chapter seven hundred and
224 fifty-one of the acts of the present year, a sum not ex-
225 ceeding eleven thousand dollars.

226 For the salaries and expenses of the directors of the
227 port of Boston, as authorized by chapter seven hundred
228 and forty-eight of the acts of the present year, a sum not
229 exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars.

230 For the salary of the accountant of the board of rail-
231 road commissioners, as authorized by chapter seven
232 hundred and fifty-five of the acts of the present year,
233 a sum not exceeding nine hundred dollars; and for ex-
234 penses of experts employed by said board, as authorized
235 by the same act, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dol-
236 lars, both amounts to be in addition to any amounts
237 heretofore appropriated for the purpose, and to be paid
238 out of the Railroad Commissioners' Fund.

239 For expenses of an investigation by the tax commis-
240 sioner of the taxation of foreign corporations, as author-
241 ized by chapter one hundred and fifty-eight of the
242 resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding fifteen
243 hundred dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
