## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Three.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH OF A SUM OF MONEY TO EDWARD R. KNUROW, A CONSERVATION OFFICER.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a  
2 moral obligation, there shall be allowed and paid  
3 from the state treasury to Edward R. Knurow, a  
4 conservation officer in the department of conserva-  
5 tion, the sum of one thousand dollars and ninety-one  
6 cents, which sum of money is due him under the pro-  
7 visions of section twenty-four of chapter seven hun-  
8 dred and eight of the acts of nineteen hundred and  
9 forty-one, as most recently amended by chapter two  
10 hundred and three of the acts of nineteen hundred  
11 and forty-seven.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
