## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

### AN ACT TRANSFERRING THE BRISTOL COUNTY TUBERCULOSIS HOSPITAL TO THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The trustees of the Bristol County tuberculosis  
2 hospital are hereby authorized and directed to convey to the  
3 commonwealth the Bristol County tuberculosis hospital and so  
4 much of the estate on which it is situated as is used for the pur-  
5 poses of the construction and also the personal property held or  
6 used for the purposes of the institution.

1 SECTION 2. The commissioner of public health is hereby au-  
2 thorized and directed to accept such conveyance in the name and  
3 behalf of the commonwealth.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. The Legislative Power

Section 1. The Legislature shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of members elected by the electors of the several counties.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members elected by the electors of the several counties.

Section 4. The members of the Senate shall hold their offices for four years.

Section 5. The members of the House of Representatives shall hold their offices for two years.

Section 6. The Legislature shall assemble on the first Monday in January.

Section 7. The Legislature shall have the power to impeach and remove any officer of the State.

Section 8. The Legislature shall have the power to create and alter the offices of the State.

Section 9. The Legislature shall have the power to pass laws that are necessary and proper.

Section 10. The Legislature shall have the power to regulate the militia of the State.
