AN ACT PROVIDING FINES FOR SMOKING IN PUBLIC CONVEYANCES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 272 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 43A, as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, and
3 inserting in place thereof the following section: —
4 Section 43A. Whoever, in or upon a railroad carriage,
5 steamboat, bus, except a chartered bus, or other public
6 conveyance, or in a terminal of the Massachusetts Bay
7 Transportation Authority, after being requested by the person in
8 charge of such conveyance or premises not to do so, or by an
9 operator, guard or other employee of the corporation or authority
10 operating the railroad, steamboat, bus, or other public
11 conveyance, smokes or carries an open flame or lighted match,
12 cigar, cigarette or pipe, shall be punished by imprisonment for
13 not more than ten days or by a fine of not more than one hundred
14 dollars, or both.
