

ACTS, 1980. - Chaps. 13, 14.

SECTION 3. Any person who knowingly files a certificate required by section two, which is false, and who thereby receives payment for goods and services which were not received by or rendered according to the statements required by said section two shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year or by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars, or both.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 13. AN ACT AUTHORIZING PLYMOUTH COUNTY TO OPERATE AND MAINTAIN AN AIRPLANE FOR THE DETECTION AND PREVENTION OF FOREST FIRES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Plymouth county are hereby authorized to operate and maintain an airplane for the detection and prevention of forest fires and for such other public safety purposes as they may deem appropriate.

SECTION 2. Chapter twenty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-nine and chapter thirty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-eight are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 14. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMISSIONER OF BANKS TO APPOINT THE NATIONAL CREDIT UNION ADMINISTRATION BOARD AS LIQUIDATING AGENT OF A CLOSED CREDIT UNION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 167 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 26 the following section:-

Section 26A. The commissioner may, under his hand and official seal, appoint the National Credit Union Administration Board as the liquidating agent of a credit union insured by the National Credit Union Administration Board. Upon its acceptance of the appointment, said board as liquidating agent shall acquire both legal and equitable title to all of the assets, rights or claims and to all of the real or personal property of such closed credit union. Said board shall have the power to perform all acts and duties of the commissioner in the liquidation of such closed credit union. In addition, said board may also as liquidating agent aid in the liquidation of a credit union insured by it in the same manner and to the same extent as the Massachusetts
