The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TOTAL CONSTRUCTION GRANT
BY THE COMMONWEALTH FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC SCHOOL
BUILDINGS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:*

1 Section 9 of chapter 645 of the acts of 1948, as most
2 recently amended by section 2 of chapter 528 of the
3 acts of 1950, is hereby further amended by striking out
4 the second paragraph and inserting in place thereof the
5 following paragraph: —

6 The total construction grant for any approved school
7 project in any city or town shall be one fourth of the
8 product of the final approved cost of the project multi-
9 plied by the equalized valuation per pupil in net aver-
10 age membership for the entire commonwealth divided
11 by the equalized valuation per pupil in net average mem-
12 bership of the city or town; provided, however, that no
13 grant shall be approved for an amount less than fifty
14 per cent of such approved cost.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

Article I. The Legislature shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

Section 1. The Senate shall be composed of six members, to be chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth.

Section 3. The Senate and House of Representatives shall be chosen at the same time and in the same manner.

Section 4. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeaching and trying the Governor, Judges, and other officers of the Commonwealth.

Section 5. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeaching and trying the Judges and other officers of the Commonwealth.

Section 6. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of passing and approving the appointments of the Governor, Judges, and other officers of the Commonwealth.
