AN ACT REPEALING PROVISIONS FOR REVIEW UNDER THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW OF REMOVALS AND DISCHARGES SUBJECT TO CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subdivision (2) of section 16 of chapter 32 of the

3 acts of 1951, is hereby amended by inserting after the word
4 "service", in line 6, the words: — , if such removal or discharge
5 is not subject to the provisions of sections forty-three and forty-
6 five of chapter thirty-one.

1 SECTION 2. Subdivision (3) of said section 16 is hereby
2 amended by striking out paragraph (b) as appearing in section 1
3 of chapter 658 of the acts of 1945.
