The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Four.

AN ACT RELATING TO THE DISSOLVING OF CERTAIN POLITICAL COMMITTEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 1173 of the acts of 1973 is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 14 and inserting in place thereof the
3 following section: —
4 *Section 14.* The state secretary, within thirty days of the
5 effective date of this act, shall notify by registered mail, return
6 receipt requested, any non-elected political committee which is
7 in existence on said effective date as to the provisions of this act.
8 Any such non-elected committee may file a statement of
9 organization as required by section four of chapter fifty-five of
10 the General Laws, as amended by section one of this act, within
11 fourteen days after the receipt of such notification; provided,
12 however, that if no such statement is filed, said non-elected
13 political committee shall be considered to have been dissolved.
