

By Mr. Madden, petition of William C. Madden for legislation to authorize the town of Tewksbury to appropriate money in connection with the celebration of the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the incorporation of said town. Municipal Finance.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF TEWKSBURY TO APPROPRIATE MONEY IN CONNECTION WITH THE CELEBRATION OF THE TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE INCORPORATION OF SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause (27)
2 of section five of chapter forty of the General Laws, the town
3 of Tewksbury is hereby authorized to appropriate, annually or
4 periodically, a sum of money to be expended for entertain-
5 ment and other events in connection with the proposed cele-
6 bration of the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of its in-
7 corporation. Any money so appropriated shall be placed in a
8 special fund, and the principal and accumulated income there-
9 of shall be used in the year of the celebration of such anni-
10 versary.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Constitution of the State

As amended by the Convention of 1875.

SECTION 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives, which shall be styled the General Assembly.

SECTION 2. The Senate shall be composed of twelve members, who shall be elected by the electors of the State at the same time and in the same manner as the electors of the House of Representatives.

SECTION 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the electors of the State, who shall be styled Representatives. The number of Representatives shall not exceed thirty, and shall be apportioned among the several counties, according to the number of electors in each county, as ascertained at the time of the next preceding general election. The electors in each county shall be qualified to elect Representatives.

SECTION 4. The electors shall vote at the polls.
