AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE WIDENING, RECONSTRUCTION
AND RELOCATION OF ROUTE 138, SO CALLED, IN THE
TOWNS OF SOMERSET, DIGHTON, TAUNTON AND RAYNHAM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 The department of public works is hereby authorized
2 and directed to reconstruct Route 138, so called, from
3 the Brightman Street bridge in Somerset to a point
4 in the town of Raynham, to relocate portions of said
5 route to avoid the most thickly populated areas, and
6 to widen the same so that it will be a four-lane high-
7 way. For the purpose of this act the said department
8 may expend such sums as may hereafter be appropri-
9 ated from the Highway Fund.
