AN ACT ENLARGING THE POWER OF CITIES AND TOWNS RELATIVE TO CERTAIN INTERNAL FINANCIAL AND ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 43B is hereby amended by inserting after sec-
2 tion 13, added by section of chapter 734 of the acts of 1966,
3 the following section:—

4 *Section 13A.* Subject to the provisions of the preceding
5 section, cities and towns may:

6 (1) create revolving funds, establish their purpose and
7 provide for their use and control;

8 (2) create stabilization funds, establish their purpose and
9 provide for their use and control;

10 (c) establish the organization and structure of their
11 municipal government;

12 (d) establish the number of registered voters required to
13 sign an annual warrant article, said number not to exceed
14 one hundred.
