AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE USE OF CERTAIN PERIODS OF MILITARY LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING WORLD WAR II OF THOMAS FREELEY OF BOSTON AS CREDITABLE SERVICE TOWARDS HIS RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special  
2 law to the contrary, upon retirement, Thomas Freeley of  
3 Boston shall be allowed creditable service towards his retire-  
4 ment benefits that period he was on military leave of absence  
5 from his employment with the City of Boston during World  
6 War II from April 16, 1942 to September 11, 1945, both dates  
7 inclusive.

The Board of Directors of the National Bank of Commerce, New York, in its resolution of the 15th day of January, 1901, authorized the Board to issue bonds in the amount of \$1,000,000, and to sell the same in such manner as it might deem proper, and to execute all such contracts and documents as may be required in connection with the issue and sale of such bonds, and to do all such other and various things as the Board may deem proper and necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this resolution.

### The Board of Directors of the National Bank of Commerce

Resolved, That the Board of Directors of the National Bank of Commerce do hereby authorize the Board to issue bonds in the amount of \$1,000,000, and to sell the same in such manner as it might deem proper, and to execute all such contracts and documents as may be required in connection with the issue and sale of such bonds, and to do all such other and various things as the Board may deem proper and necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this resolution.

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
